Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. Matthew 6:19-20

The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful. Mathew 13:22

The Secular Church, The Examiner


The expression "secular church" may be a contradiction in terms, but it is what many sociologists say is emerging on the American religious scene.

Matthew 5:46-48

How we love displays who or what we love

Pagans seem to have self serving love, love that benefits them or their relationships

The Pagan Kingdom

And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Matthew 6:7

A pagan is someone who believes that by their own effort they can be heard by God. They do not trust that God loves them wholly and completely because He created them

The Pagan Kingdom For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. Matthew 6:32

So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' vs 31


Pagans are those who are focused on the senses (sensual-ists)

The Pagan Kingdom

If they still refuse to listen, tell it to the church; and if they refuse to listen even to the church, treat them as you would a pagan or a tax collector. Matthew 18:17

If your brother or sister sins, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you. If they listen to you, you have won them over. vs 15

A pagan is one who refuses to listen, who's pride has blinded them to sin



After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. Acts 1:3
