


Tale of Two Martha's




"Quite so! You have not observed. And yet you have seen. That is just my point. Now, I know that there are seventeen steps, because I have both seen and observed."



It is more likely that Martha was a wealthy widow who took care of her younger siblings








The Jewish view of "faith,"

Faith is active and includes the "works" of following Torah. The foundational statement of faith in Judaism is the "Shema," from Deuteronomy 6:4. The term "hear" means to hear and respond obediently. Faith and obedience are woven together.

Walking in God's Torah is a sign of established faith, as founded in: Exodus 16:4; Leviticus 18:3-4

On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Luke 10:25

"how do I earn my salvation thus insuring my admittance into heaven?"

But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?" vs 29

The Good Samaritan

"Which of these three do you think was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?" The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise." vs 36-37

"Woman," Jesus replied, "believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You Samaritans worship what you do not know... John 4:22-22

who went into a Samaritan village to get things ready for him; but the people there did not welcome him Luke 9:52-53 "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, but few things are needed—or indeed only one. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her." vs 41-42

There is only one thing worth being concerned about. Mary has discovered it, and it will not be taken away from her. vs 42 NLT

If you are concerned about earning God's favour/love you will be equally dismayed about your sin

Our actions positive and negative distract us from the one "good" thing, Jesus

Lessons from Luke 10

The 60 experienced the power of Jesus but never crossed over into faith and trust

The Good Samaritan left by itself leads the listener to believe that behaviour is all Jesus requires

Martha had the Messiah in her living room but never "saw" who He was

You are like whitewashed tombs, which look beautiful on the outside but on the inside are full of the bones of the dead and everything unclean. In the same way, on the outside you appear to people as righteous but on the inside you are full of hypocrisy and wickedness.

Matthew 23:27-28

"These people honour me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me.
They worship me in vain; their teachings are merely human rules."
Matthew 15:8-9 quoting Isaiah 29:13

Easter is the radical transformation of the requirements of faith. God moves past our hard outer shell of behaviour to wrestle with our darkness we hide within.

He answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind; and, 'Love your neighbour as yourself." Luke 10:27
