




Hermeneutics

Hermeneutic Principle The law of non-modification

If scripture states something, but then modifies it at another point, we realize that the subject being addressed is a continuous theme

If scripture does not, then it is considered closed



He is talking about the War of the Roses, a civil war over the throne of England between the houses of Lancaster and York. At this point, the war proper is over - the Yorkists have defeated the Lancasters, and Edward IV, a York, now sits on the throne. Thus, the war ("our discontent") has come to a close ("winter of"), which resulted in victory ("glorious summer") for the Yorks ("sun of York"), and so drawing to a close the York's major problems.
